TURTLEFORD HOSPITAL AUXILIARY INC. SCHOLARSHIP

APPLICATION GUIDE

The Turtleford Hospital Auxiliary is offering two \$500 Scholarships to high school graduates entering a health-related field at an accredited educational institution.

The scholarships are available to grade XII students graduating from these high schools: Paradise Hill, St. Walburg, Thunderchild First Nation, Turtleford, Glaslyn and Edam. Applicants must meet the following criteria.

1. The student must be entering a health-related field after graduation and must attend an accredited educational institution for career preparation.
2. A school-based transcript of grade eleven and twelve courses and grades along with courses and **mid-term grades of the last semester** must be submitted with the application form.
3. Academic achievement is a top criteria for this scholarship, however the candidate with the top academic standing within the pool of applicants for that academic year may not always be the successful candidate.
4. The applicant will include a type-written essay with a minimum of three hundred words describing the candidate's career choice and the personal motivation and rationale that led the candidate to that career choice.
5. The application form, the school-based transcript, mid-term grades and the essay must be delivered or mailed to the Chairperson of the Hospital Auxiliary (see cover letter for name and address) **postmarked on or before Friday, May 22, 2026, the application deadline.** The Hospital Auxiliary Adjudication Committee will review all applications.
6. The successful candidate will receive the scholarship funds only after presenting formal proof of having successfully completed semester one of their post-secondary program.
7. The names and contact numbers for three references must be provided. Please note that the references may not be related to the candidate.
8. The successful candidate will receive written notification, with a copy to be forwarded to school administration.

The Clark Scholarship In Memeory Of Gertrude Evelyn Calrk (Neumann)

To commemorate the contributions of the late Mrs. G. E. Clark (Neumann) in her 31 years of teaching, her family has established a scholarship to be awarded to student from St. Walburg High School entering any college at the University of Saskatchewan. Students must have attended the school for at least their grade 10, 11, and 12 years. The award will be made by the St. Walburg School staff to the University's Scholarship and Awards Office.

- Proposed Name:** The Clark Scholarship, awarded in memory of Gertrude Evelyn Clark (Neumann)
- Source of Funding:** The Clark Family
- Amount of Funding:** Initially \$10 000, as of 1998, \$20 000
- Tenability:** It is intended that the award continue in perpetuity. In the event that unforeseen circumstances make the specified use of this gift no longer practical or desirable, the Board of Governors of the University of Saskatchewan is authorized to make changes in its use in keeping as far as possible with the spirit and general intent of the gift.
- Suggested Awarded Value:** Approximately 80% of the annual interest earned. The Award is currently established at \$750.00 and will be reviewed regularly to ensure that it's relative value is maintained. Any unspent earnings will be added annually to the corpus of the trust.
- Program & Course Designations & Restrictions:** Entry Scholarship for first year of study full time at the University of Saskatchewan - no restrictions as to college or course of study.
- Designation of Selection Committee:** The Principal and staff of St. Walburg School will make a recommendation to the University's Scholarship and Awards Office and/or the Director of Admissions. The University will assess the candidate's status as an applicant for enrolment and communicate the result to the school.
- Review Of Funding:** To be conducted according to normal procedures to ensure that the value of the award is maintained.

Selection Criterion:

1. Students must have completed at least their last 3 years of high school at St. Walburg School.
2. Scholarship monies are restricted to the support of Tuition fees.
3. In the event of a tie the award money will be equally divided between no more than two students.
4. In the event that an award is not made in any given year the earnings will be retained as capital.
5. Selection by Staff and Principal will be on the basis of:
 - a) Academic Standing - based on an average of Grade 10 and 11 final marks and third term Grade 12 marks. This academic standing will account for 80% of the total.
 - b) Extracurricular Standing - based on the extracurricular service to the school in Grades 10, 11, and 12, which account for the remaining 20%.
 - c) A commitment to enroll in a full time course of study at the University of Saskatchewan.
